


Bug Club Update Summer 2020

Well done for accessing lots of reading on Bug Club. The pupils are all doing really well and the teachers are looking at how well you are progressing. Here is a little bit more information of how some parts of it work.

When Pupils come to their home page on Bug Club there are some tabs at the top that say: **My Home, My Stuff, My Library, My Rewards, Log out** and **Grown-ups**.

We would like to make you aware of how the **My Stuff** and **My Library** tabs work.



What is the **My Stuff** section?

The **My Stuff** section shows pupils how many books they have left.


They must answer all questions in the books so that the program recognises that you need to be allocated more books. Teachers are able to see this and can allocate more books and also reallocate a book if the pupil needs to read it again. The questions in the books are designed to support their understanding of what they have read and should be done independently. Sometimes pupils may need to type answers – these can be seen by their teachers. Teachers may mark these questions with a **Traffic Light** answer which they can see alongside a written response to help them next time they are answering questions.

What is the **My Library** section?

The **My Library** section shows all the books that the pupils have read and keeps them stored so that should they need to go back and read any of them, they can. This is always a good idea! You can then ask your child to re-read any of them to you. This supports their 'reading aloud' skills too.

The **My Library** section will also be where pupils will receive feedback from a book they have read. Not all books will require feedback. As mentioned above, a teacher can reallocate a book to the pupil's library to try again if they haven't quite understood it.

If a little blue envelope appears on the **My Library** tab this means that a question your child has answered has been responded to. These types of questions require the pupil think and give a more detailed answer. They should always try and link their answer to what they have read when answering the question.



The Treasure Chest. The more books that a pupil reads and the more answers they get correct, the more points they will get in their Treasure Chest. Feel free to explore this as you please! It allows the pupils to use their 'treasure' within the program to create virtual sticker books, mini worlds and play games.
